- I despised the grading system in this class. I think its a poor system to rely on two essays and two exams for a grade especially as a level 200 course. It gives students very little room to try and make up a poor score. I would take a weekly assignment over 4 big grades for the semester in a heartbeat. Having big assignments doesn't help learn the content as we progress through the course.

- If it's possible to record lectures, that would be really helpful. Having the lecture slides beforehand was nice, but I know I personally would have also appreciated being able to listen to the lecture if I missed class. Especially because there are some discussions that happen in class that I know I miss out on if I'm sick
- I enjoy how minimal the class is, but maybe blog posts as homework every now and then would be nice, just to give a little cushion for our grades.
- In a large environment, it may be intimidating to speak and answer a question. One thing that Dr. Lambeth did during one of the lectures is she gave us time to talk to our peers about a topic then gathered us back again to talk about what we discussed. In think giving time to talk amongst our peers makes it less intimidating to share our ideas and may allow for a wider variety of students to feel comfortable to share their ideas.
- For the essays, maybe try not to be so harsh when grading them, and maybe try one of the essays where we just state our opinion. For example, the abortion essay, you could simply do whether we are pro-life or pro-choice, and still include excerpts from the reading that sides with our view. It's just that the prompts can be a little hard to answer, and I felt like I was beating around the bush the whole time, and not actually hitting the bullseye with what was being looked for for that prompt.

- I feel that the written portions were graded very harshly. I wish there would be more instruction with what is specifically wanted
- One suggestion for improving this course is increasing the amount of assignments/projects that go into deciphering grades. It can appear daunting that one assignment can really make or break your grade considering the 2 papers and 2 tests all comprise of 20% of the grade. It might be beneficial to add quizzes or weekly homework assignments that can help students stay on course and up to date with the homework. Because technically there is no way knowing if students read the assigned readings, it can be helpful to make assignments or quizzes that go along with the content covered in the readings that way it forces students to complete the readings prior to class.
- At times, it feels like I am not rewarded for hard work I do in the class. I feel the grading for papers and exam free response questions are harsh, but the multiple choice sections were fair. I also wished I could have gotten feedback on my paper or free response grades
- I would offer more information on what is expected of for the papers.
- It would be nice if she recorded her lectures to go back and review. Also it would be nice to have a study guide for the exam.
- I have no suggestions for the instructor, but I would suggest, if possible, splitting up the lectures into smaller sections- perhaps even two sections, instead of one. As it currently stands, it is difficult to engage the entire class or discuss things fully with so many people.
- The slides and lectures could have been a bit more interactive or less "read off of". Maybe a bit more in class discussion or personal application/interpretation.
- Providing more sample questions for the final would be helpful, or releasing old exams if they exist. I'm not really sure exactly what the final exam questions will look like.
- I would say that allowing more time for students to complete the attendance quizzes would be better.
- Try to make the content more interesting. Simply reading off the slides which is the same content that we read in our assigned reading gets boring after the first week or so.
- I wish we had more study material for the exams. I also wish she and the TAs communicated more about the course objectives because at times, they gave conflicting responses or they weren't on the same page.
- Recorded lectures and not making the class 100 points. I have been to lecture most days this semester and I'm going to get a B when I have done all that has been asked of me. I have read, been to lecture, studied the slides. I got graded so harshly on papers, when this isn't an english class. I shouldn't be receiving a B in an elective class.
- Maybe split the class into more sections for better participation in Lecture.
- A slight criticism: gender-neutral language i.e. pregnant people, is important to be used, however saying "pregnant person" and then only using the gendered pronoun "her," still implies that only women can be pregnant, therefore not being inclusive of other genders Using the pronoun "they" is the convention when using gender-neutral language, and it's important to use always, but especially in a class covering ethical issues and medical topics, because it is medically acknowledged that both gender and biological sex are not a strict binary.
- This might not end up being an issue at all if the final exam goes well for the class (I would not know yet), but the idea of having quote identifications on an exam is not my favorite. I believe the goal of the class is to understand the concepts and the people behind the concepts that were taught, which would be best done by hypothetical questions, or even definitions. Quote identification just makes me think I have to spend more time memorizing and regurgitating the readings (again, I have not taken the exam yet, so this might not an issue at all).
- It would have been helpful to have been able to get through all of the slides on the PowerPoint each lecture so that I had heard all of the main parts of the lecture from the professor. Usually there was one or two slides we wouldn't be able to get to so I just had to read the information on the slide to know what it was about instead of hearing Dr. Lambeth discuss it.
